There is Bi-Partisan Agreement...

Electronic voting machines can facilitate the rigging of elections by enemies foreign and domestic.

ARNEBECK: And would that program that you designed be something that elections officials, that might be on county boards of elections, could detect?

CURTIS: They'd never see it.

ARNEBECK: Would you answer that question once again?

CURTIS: They would never see it.

After consultation with Mr. Curtis and others, Germany, Netherlands and Italy got rid of their electronic voting machines. France uses paper ballots and voting is done in one day.

The programming and vulnerabilities of the voting machines has only gotten more sophisticated and corrupt.
